

Center Overview

Bridgeview Community Mental Health Center, is a private, non-profit corporation chartered by the State of Iowa to provide a broad range of community mental health services. The organization serves Clinton county and the surrounding area in Iowa and Illinois.

Services include outpatient, school and community based support programs for individuals with a wide range of mental health problems. Treatment may be provided for problems which are situational and/or connected to a social condition or significant life event, such as anxiety, depression from the loss of a loved one, etc.; or it may be related to psychiatric illnesses which are chronic or long term in nature, as in conditions such as bi-polar disorder, or schizophrenia. Individuals of all ages, backgrounds and income levels are served. Each year, thousands of individuals and families are served at our various offices and facilities.

To carry out its mission, Bridgeview employs a staff of approximately 60 employees throughout its various locations. Outpatient offices' staff include psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, mental health counselors and mental health nurses. These professionals, all of whom are credentialed and experienced, with physicians who are Board certified or Board eligible, are supported by various management and administrative/office personnel, as well as clinical case managers who staff Community Services programs.

We work closely with affiliated hospitals, including Mercy Medical Center in Clinton, ensuring a continuum of care to clients in programming and services. We also coordinate with agencies and offices such as the Department of Human Services, Juvenile Court Services, county case management and our CPC's, Substance Abuse Services, the police and local sheriff's offices, Pathways Living Center, and local school systems in Clinton and Jackson counties.
